## Do your conflict of interest policies apply to students, residents, and faculty while they rotate/work at outside hospitals/clinics?

Yes for all faculty, both full and part time. Medical students must abide by Columbia's COI policy and standards that are specific to our students. Residents are employees of New York-Presbyterian Hospital (our major affiliate) or other affiliated institutions and therefore must adhere to the COI policies (submitted).

Do the policies also apply to private clinician offices that trainees may rotate through? Yes.

# Does your medical school have a conflict of interest curriculum for medical students, residents, and/or faculty? If so, please indicate to whom the curriculum is offered or required?

Yes, the medical school has a mandatory curriculum on COI for medical students. For residents, the primary affiliated hospital (sharing a campus) New York-Presbyterian Hospital also has a mandatory curriculum on COI for residents (who are hospital employees). For faculty doing any kind of research there is a mandatory COI curriculum. For faculty, their clinical appointment at New York-Presbyterian Hospital requires completion of a COI curriculum.

## Is the medical school curriculum either offered OR required for medical students, residents, and/or faculty?

Yes, these curricula are required for medical students and residents (see response above). Yes, these curricula are required for all faculty doing research of any kind.

### In what form is the curriculum presented?

For the medical students and residents the curriculum is presented as live lectures with PowerPoint slides. For faculty doing research, the curriculum is an online presentation with PowerPoint slides and a test on the material.
