"a. The [REDACTED] conflict of interest policies applies to all faculty and employees of [REDACTED] and applies to this group when the rotate/work at outside hospitals and clinics.

b. The [REDACTED] University conflict of interest policy applies to all employees and faculty members of [REDACTED] University including faculty and employees of [REDACTED].

c. All employees of [REDACTED] University Health System, including residents and fellows, are subject to the [REDACTED] University Health System conflict of interest policy and applies to them when they rotate/work at outside hospitals/clinics. This policy was created in collaboration with the [REDACTED] policy."

Do the policies also apply to private clinician offices that trainees may rotate through?

"a. Private clinicians who precept students are required to abide by all policies and procedures of [REDACTED] University and its Schools and Colleges which includes the [REDACTED] University COI policy as well as the [REDACTED] Policy. This information and a link to applicable policies are provided in their appointment letter."

Does your medical school have a conflict of interest curriculum for medical students, residents, and/or faculty? If so, please indicate to whom the curriculum is offered or required?

"a. The medical school does provide instruction to medical students on conflict of interest throughout their ethics in medicine curriculum. [REDACTED] also has a conflict of interest curriculum specifically for students enrolled in the Masters in bioethics program. Conflict of interest training is required every four years for faculty members, employees and students who have PHS funded research."

Is the medical school curriculum either offered OR required for medical students, residents, and/or faculty?

"a. The medical school conflict of interest curriculum is offered for students in the Masters in Bioethics program. The conflict of interest training is available for all faculty members and employees and required for employees who are investigators on PHS funded research."

In what form is the curriculum presented?

"a. The curriculum is presented in PowerPoint slides and live lectures upon request."
