Students – Yes – On the second Campus a COI curriculum within the required Essentials of Clinical Medicine Course for all 170 based students that spans across their first and second year. On our Campus, students are first exposed to conflict of interest issues in their first-year orientation week. There are two PBL cases with conflict of interest learning objectives, one in first year and one in second-year. There is conflict of interest training in Social and Behavioral Medicine II, occurring in the second-year. All of the above are required courses and all 60 of our medical students attend.

Is the medical school curriculum either offered OR required for medical students, residents, and/or faculty?

Residents – there is a policy but no formal curriculum; Faculty – yes required once every 4 years

Campus

■ 1 hour on-line and 1 hour in person lecture, followed by 2.5 hour small group exercise. Focus on COI with pharma. Course exam includes a short answer question on this content.

■ 3 hour large group session (with small group breakouts) on COI in physician reimbursement. Again, course exam includes a short answer question on this content.

■ 1 hour interactive session to delineate the three types of incentives that drive behavior and apply these incentives to possible COI in clinical care.

• The curriculum is presented in a variety of forms. The orientation session consists of second-year students performing skits with conflict of interest scenarios and having the first-year students comment. Conflict of interest learning objectives are discussed in small group PBL sessions. A formal conflict of interest lecture is given to second-year students in Social and Behavioral II as part of our ethics curriculum.

Residents: Program Directors are responsible for educating their trainees on the proper protocol for interacting with industry representatives. Program Manuals may have specific policies. Hospitals may also have specific policies.

Faculty: Electronic course that takes 20-30 minutes to complete – details at
